It has been a very fast and exciting term, with lots of amazing learning going on. Year 5 have shown us their green fingers by working with teachers from Brockworth Academy to grow vegetables and plants in the poly-tunnel. There was some amazing artwork produced in Science and art week last week. I was very impressed with the quality of observation shown by the children, particularly Year R who carefully observed and drew real fish from the fishmonger! Year 6 have impressed me with their focus, resilience, maturity and honesty during their mock test week. All of the adults are very proud of them. I was also impressed by the maturity and respect shown by all of the children in the school this week when we held an assembly to reflect on what it means to live in a multi-cultural society and why acts of terrorism are wrong. The children across the school were very clear in their understanding of the importance of free speech and respecting the ideas and cultures of others. They were also able to identify the inappropriateness of imposing ideas on others by inciting fear or harm. They enjoyed joining in with our "Live As One" song and showed sensitivity in a minute of silent reflection. All of the children are aware that if they are worried about terrorism then they can speak with a trusted adult.

2. Enter your details-name, email address, child's name
3. Choose the relevant clubs for your child (a maximum of 2 choices will be allowed initially to ensure everyone has equal opportunity to select a club)
