

The Physical Education and Sports Grant – 2015-16

In April 2013 the government announced new funding to improve the provision of physical activity and sport in schools so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles. The grant is separate from the school's budget share. Schools decide how the money can best be allocated to ensure that as many children as possible access and enjoy high quality Physical Education, a range of physical Extra-Curricular activities and events, in addition to the opportunity to learn about healthy lifestyles.

At Hillview Primary School Primary we support the physical development of all our pupils. We do this by providing high quality teaching, supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required. The School Leadership Team and the Governing Body monitors the impact of all spending and interventions, including the PE and Sports Grant.

Basis of the allocation

For the 2015/16 academic year, allocations are calculated on the following basis: Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.
