GROUPING POLICY: Two tiered sets in each population and 2 mixed ability sets in each population

COURSE CONTENT:

What will my child learn?

Study of philosophical questions to explore religious and non-religious viewpoints. The first unit is called 'Do we need God?' and looks at reasons for theism, atheism and agnosticism. The second unit is entitled 'Where do people look for inspiration?' and analyses how inspirational some people are such as Malala and Mother Teresa. The final unit explores the question 'Is Buddhism a religion?' to understand what Buddhism teaches and how useful it may be to lead a good and happy life. The students will develop their debating skills, their empathy with and understanding of others alongside a variety of philosophical or ethical approaches to world challenges.

What will homework look like?

Extended Learning Opportunities Projects, literacy homework, correction homework, mini research tasks and consolidation of classroom work will all be used on a regular basis.

What enrichment opportunities are available?

Fieldwork days for each population will be confirmed as they are planned, local opportunities around the school site or local area will be utilised where appropriate. If available national competitions, guest speakers and charity links will be pursued.

How will my child's work be assessed?

Termly assessed pieces of work. Extended Learning Opportunities. Vocabulary tests. Questioning within classroom activities. Year 7 exam.
