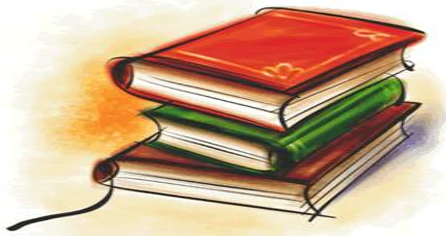




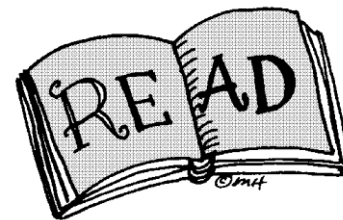

Simple, compound and complex sentences



Speaking & Listening



- **Simple** - Contains only one piece of information / one main idea e.g. The car was blue.
- **Compound** - Two simple sentences joined by a connective or a semi-colon e.g. The car was blue; it had a huge spoiler.
- **Complex** - Contains one main idea and an extra piece of information e.g. Although the car was old, it was eye-catching.

To be a fantastic writer, you need to add a variety of the above sentences in your work.

- **Complex** - Contains one main idea and an extra piece of information

e.g. Although the car was old, it was eye-catching.

Don't forget to put a comma after your extra information
