

# Y3 Curriculum Information

## Topics covered this term include:

Science – The skeleton

R.E. – Chinese New Year – 28<sup>th</sup> January, Christian places of worship.

Geography – Plans and maps; compass directions; grid references

P.E. – Outdoor games – large ball skills  
Indoor Dance - folk dancing  
Real PE Scheme – Dynamic Balance

## Literacy

Some of the work covered in Literacy this term will include

- Shape poetry.
- Characterisation through traditional tales, myths, legends and fables from Aesop.
- Punctuation – commas and inverted commas
- Adjectives, singular and plurals.
- Compound words eg. snow + man = snowman
- Suffixes – -ly, -ful, -less, -er, -able.

## Mathematics

Some of the work covered in oral maths this term will include

- Recall addition and subtraction facts to 20.
- State subtraction and corresponding addition fact.
- Add 3 then 4 single digit numbers, eg.  $3 + 7 + 2 + 9 =$ .
- Counting on and back in 10's and 100's from any 2 or 3 digit number eg. 63 or 258.
- Table facts from the x2, x3, x4, x5, x6, x8 and x10 tables and derive division facts.
- Multiplying by 10 and 100.
- Recall pairs of multiples with a total of 1000 eg.  $400 + 600$ .

Some of the work covered in topic maths this term will include

- Reading, writing and ordering numbers to 1000.
- Reading the time in 1 minute intervals on an analogue clock and a digital clock eg. twenty five minutes past 10 or 10:25, ten minutes past 3 or 3:10.
- 24 hour clock
- Money, including 'real life' problems eg. It costs 75p for a child to go swimming, how much does it cost for two children?
- Problems and puzzles involving solid shapes.
- Reading scales and dials.
- Read and write the vocabulary of direction, eg. right angled turns, compass points.
