

What assessment will look like in maths:

- All students will have flight path records in the front of their books. These will be completed, with targets, after each tracking and transferred to each new book.
- At the beginning of each topic all students will have an objective sheet for the topic. The “before” column will be completed by the student.
- At the completion of each topic, all students will complete the “after” column of the objective sheet and a reflection on their learning and write themselves a self-assessment comment relating to their progress through the topic.
- At the completion of each topic, the teacher will mark the work and write a strength and target to improve on the objective sheet. A target question will be provided for students to complete in purple pen before the next topic is begun.
- Throughout each topic, timely AFL / feedback will be given. Self / peer assessment will be recorded in purple pen, as will student response to feedback. All class books will show evidence of regular and timely feedback.
- All assessments will be stored in student’s folders.

KS3

- 2018 / 19 all of year 7 and 8 students will complete an entry and exit test for each topic, which will be stuck in their books with their objective sheets. 2019 onwards all of KS3 will do this.
- Home Learning will be mymaths and monitored by the class teacher. For shared classes homework must be split evenly between the class teachers with no more than one piece being set each week and must be relevant to the current topic.
- Students will complete 4 formal assessments each year. These are adapted GCSE papers, marked in accordance with the GCSE mark scheme and graded to GCSE grade boundaries. These assessments will form the basis of the WAG. These assessments will be marked by teachers and recorded onto the department tracking sheet. Feedback will be given to students and recorded on their papers in purple pen.
- Low stakes basic skills tests will take place once each fortnight. Students peer assess and set their own target to improve.

KS4

- At the end of each topic, students will complete an end of topic assessment. These will be self / peer marked. Immediate feedback will be given and recorded by students in purple pen.
- Home learning will be mymaths, pixl maths app or worksheet, as the teacher deems appropriate. Students will receive immediate feedback on the due date.
- Full formal assessments in the form of full GCSE papers will take place in December and May of year 10 and November and March of year 11.
