

## The Beacon Centre Achievements and outcomes 2016-17

### Key Stage 4

- ✓ 100% of year 11's who engaged with the service achieved a qualification in both Maths and English.
- ✓ The average point score per pupil who attended full time was 121.8 this is just below our best score of 122.0 achieved in 2015
- ✓ Three pupils(17.6%) gained 5 A\*-G(9-1)GCSE's or equivalent
- ✓ All those entered for GCSE's achieved a grade( no "U" grades)
- ✓ Year 11 attendance was the second best in the last 7 years at 71.04%
- ✓ Two year 10's achieved Functional skills Level 1 in both English and ICT and one gained an additional Level 2 in Home Cooking Skills GCSE
- ✓ 7 Pupils succeeded in completing the "Pathways Programme"
- ✓ 50% of the year 11pupils we were directed to take in February from SSS engaged with the Centre and all of those gained a qualification in Maths & English.
- ✓ Year 10 Progress in English: 12.5% making above expected progress, 25% making expected progress, 12.5% meeting national expectations and 50% making less than expected progress given their baseline
- ✓ Year 10 Progress in Maths: 62.5% making expected progress, 12.5% making national expectations and 25% making less than expected progress given their baseline
- ✓ Year 10 Progress in ICT: 42.8% making expected progress, 28.6 meeting national expectation, and 28.6% making less than expected progress given their baseline
- ✓ There is no consistent and identifiable gap in attainment when comparing vulnerable groups to the wider centre population. This is due to the small numbers attending and the specific needs/circumstances of each cohort

### Key Stage 3

- ✓ Progress in English: 50% making expected progress, 42% meeting national expectations and 8% making less than expected progress given their baseline

- ✓ Progress in Maths: 33% making expected progress, 42% meeting national expectations and 25% making less than expected progress given their baseline.
- ✓ Progress in ICT: 55% making expected progress, 34% meeting national expectations and 11% making less than expected progress given their baseline

#### Primary KS2 & 1

- ✓ We had no year 6's during 2016-17
- ✓ All pupils who arrive and stay for longer than a term are working well below their age related expectations and many are at least a year behind.
- ✓ All pupils in KS 2 are making slow but discernible progress in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics whilst we address their Social, Emotional & Mental Health issues.
- ✓ Pupil incidents of disruption and requiring time out have significantly decreased now that the staffing issues have been addressed
