PUPIL PREMIUM POLICY

RATIONALE

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children who have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years. The Pupil Premium is not ring-fenced and schools can choose what to spend it on.

Therefore, with the inclusion of the Pupil Premium funding into School Budgets, it is vital that this funding is spent effectively to ensure socially and economically disadvantaged pupils are able to realise their full potential, and any gap between these pupils and their peers is closed.

OBJECTIVES

- To narrow the disadvantage gap by addressing inequalities and raising the attainment of these pupils in low income families.
- To effectively utilise targeted strategies which result in all pupils having full and equal access to an enriched curriculum, quality teaching and extra-curricular experiences, irrespective of socio-economic backgrounds.

FUNDING

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and who have been looked-after (LAC) continuously for one day or more.

In 2017-18, schools will receive:

- £1320 per FSM pupil
- £1900 per LAC pupil

NB: The figures include current pupils who have been or are currently registered as Free School Meal pupils and therefore attract Pupil Premium Funding.

It is important that parents/carers register for Free School Meals to ensure the School receives the Pupil Premium entitlement. With the introduction of universal Free School Meals for all children up to the age of 7 (September 2014) it has become a priority for the school to encourage parents to register if they are in receipt of the appropriate benefits.

EFFECTIVE USE OF PUPIL PREMIUM

The 'Teaching and Learning Toolkit' (Sutton Trust 2014) has been used as a basis to determine the teaching strategies to be utilised across the Key Stage, which will be financed by the Pupil Premium.

Progress of pupils who attract a Pupil Premium is rigorously monitored using the 'RM Integris' Assessment Tool. In addition, a 'Pupil Premium Tracking' Proforma (see Appendix A) is maintained in order to provide a rigorous record of the identified pupils' learning and attainment each term.

IMPACT

Effective use of the Pupil Premium Grant 2016-17 showed that by the end of Year 2, the school has successfully raised the attainment of disadvantaged pupils when compared to the attainment of disadvantaged pupils nationally.

In addition, the gap between the attainment of disadvantaged pupils compared to other pupils in school is closing. The attainment of disadvantaged pupils will continue to be the focus of targeted interventions in 2017-18 using the Pupil Premium Grant.
