Value Statement

It is important to us to give every child the opportunity to experience a well balanced curriculum which stimulates and promotes their academic, sporting, creative, artistic and social development. We believe an innovative and varied PE curriculum has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. The money will be used to that all children benefit regardless of sporting ability.

AIMS

The government has provided funding of £150 million per year to improve the physical education and sport in primary schools. Schools have to spend the funding on improving provision of PE and Sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this. This can include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches
- New clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development
- Running sport competitions or increasing participation
- Buying assured development modules and materials

OBJECTIVES

We aim to improve the provision and participation of physical education and sport at Horbury Bridge CE J&I Academy and broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to children.

We evaluate our provision and plan our priorities and use of the Sports Premium against the DfE 5 Key Indicators (KI):

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles**
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport**
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport**
