The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian by Sherman Alexie

Arnold Spirit, Jr (known as Junior) is a budding



cartoonist who takes the astonishing step of leaving his school on the Spokane Indian Reservation ('the rez') to attend an all-white high school 22 miles from home. His parents are perplexed, his best friend sees it as an act of pure betrayal, and the white kids at his new school treat him as if he's an alien.

But somehow, Junior gradually manages to start to win their respect. Whilst being consistently hilarious, this story (much of which is based on the author's early life) also explores darker issues present in Native American communities, such as alcoholism, poverty and depression. A moving & unusual book that surprises and stays with you.


