# AS Level Music – AQA Specification 7271

#### **Outline of the course**

The AS Music listening paper will be split into three sections. 2 hour paper, 40% of AS Level.

#### Area of study 1 Western classical tradition 1650–1910 is compulsory

You will then study one other Area of Study, which you will be told when you begin in September.

# Section A (49 marks):

Part I: Questions based on unheard listening from the Western Classical Tradition (1650-1910), focusing specifically on the following genres:

- Baroque Solo Concerto
- The Operas of Mozart

Part II: Four questions based on music from the other Area of Study (can also be unheard music).

#### Section B (17 marks):

Listening Questions based on set works within Area of Study 1: Western Classical Music. More analytical and requiring deeper understanding of set works.

# Section C (30 marks):

Choice of one essay questions based on the other Area of Study (which you will be told in September).

# **The operas of Mozart**

Throughout the AS course you will study excerpts from *Le Nozze di Figaro (The Marriage of Figaro)*, composed by W.A Mozart.

This was the first opera composed during what is commonly known as Mozart's *Vienna Period*. During time spent in Vienna Mozart collaborated with a librettist called Lorenzo Da Ponte.

# Research the following information:

- 1. During what dates did Mozart live?
- 2. When was he in Vienna and compose the three Da Ponte operas?
- 3. What are the three Da Ponte operas called and in what order were they composed?
- 4. Put Le Nozze di Figaro in to its historical context:
  - a. What was going on in Europe during this time? Wars/conflict?
  - b. Was Le Nozze di Figaro composed for a particular event? If so, what?
  - c. When and where did it premiere? (where was the first performance)

#### Research regarding the Set Work itself:

- 1. Summarise the story of *Le Nozze di Figaro* as best as you can opera synopses can sometimes be confusing.
- 2. Who are and what type of VOICE type (Soprano, Mezzo Soprano, Tenor, Bass) are the following characters:
  - a. Figaro
  - b. Susanna
  - c. Bartolo
  - d. Marcellina
  - e. Cherubino

It will benefit you to include how each character is related to each other.

  - a. How are the melodies of Figaro and Susanna different at the beginning?
  - b. Does the vocal melody that Figaro sings change in style throughout the extract?
  - c. Are there different instruments of the orchestra that accompany the different characters? If so, state track timings where they might differ.
