

16-19 Bursary Fund Policy 2018/19

What is the 16-19 Bursary Fund

The fund is made available from the government through its funding body - Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) to provide assistance to students whose access to, or completion of, education is inhibited by financial constraints or barriers.

To be eligible for the bursary students must:

- be aged 16 or over but under 19 at 31 August 2018 or
- be aged 19 or over at 31 August 2018 and have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- be aged 19 or over at 31 August 2018 and continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 ('19+ continuers')
- meet the residency criteria in ESFA 2018 to 2019 academic year funding regulations for post-16 provision

To be eligible for the vulnerable bursary, students must be in one of the defined vulnerable groups:

- in care
- care leavers
- in receipt of Income Support, or Universal Credit because they are financially supporting themselves or financially supporting themselves and someone who is dependent on them and living with them such as a child or partner
- in receipt of Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in their own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in their own right

Who is not eligible for 16-19 Bursary Funding?

- Students under 16 years of age or over 19 years of age on 31 August 2018
- Students who do not meet the residency qualifications
- Students who do not fulfil any of the criteria described above

Residency qualifications

To qualify, you will need to meet all of the residence requirements. Generally, on the first day of the academic year in which your course starts, you must:

- be a UK national or have 'settled status' in the UK. 'Settled' means having either indefinite leave to enter or remain, or having the right of abode in the UK.
- be 'ordinarily resident' in England
- have been 'ordinarily resident' in the UK, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man for the three years immediately before starting the course - and not wholly or mainly for the purpose of receiving full-time education
- be studying under reciprocal exchange agreements
- be a child of a Turkish worker where the Turkish worker has been lawfully employed and resident in the UK at any time in the past and where the student has been resident in the EEA and Turkey for the full 3 year period prior to the commencement of their programme

Students who are settled in the UK may also be eligible if they have exercised a right of residence in the European Economic Area (EEA) or Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland and Norway.

'Settled status' means that there are no immigration restrictions on how long you can stay in the UK.

You're 'ordinarily resident' in England if it's where you normally live, even if you live abroad on a temporary basis. If you move from England with your family overseas due to an armed forces posting, you're also considered 'ordinarily resident' in England.

Proof of income

Evidence will be required to support this application and documentation could include proof of the following:

- Universal Credit (the three most recent monthly award statements)
- Working Tax Credit
- Income Support
- Job Seekers' Allowance
- Employment and Support Allowance
- P60 or Self-employment income evidence for everyone in the household.

How will Aylesbury High School assess applications and allocate 16-19 Bursary funding?

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is a limited fund and the school will prioritise allocation. There will be 3 priority groups, categorised as high, medium and low. Students who are eligible for any level of funding should complete an application form and hand it in to Mrs Dalby by 9am on 24th September. Applications made after this date will be considered on a case by case basis. A Bursary Fund Committee will meet to consider applications at all levels. Students who are deemed eligible should be aware that to continue to receive a bursary/funding:

- There must be no unauthorised absences during the school day
- They must maintain acceptable levels of behaviour, effort and punctuality.

The Bursary Fund Committee

The Bursary Fund Committee will normally meet three times per year (September, January and May to consider and review applications). Emergency meetings may need to be called.

The Bursary Fund Committee will be made up of the Headmaster (Chair), the Support Staff Director, a Governor and the Head of Sixth Form.

Other members of the Sixth Form staff team may offer information to the Committee about a student's circumstances, well-being, behaviour, progress and attendance.

Students and their parents/carers should understand that the available fund is limited. Any appeals against decisions can be made to the Chair of Governors, via the Clerk to the Governors who will follow the school's complaints procedure.

Financial support for Sixth Form Students in 2018/19

The following information applies to students aged 16 to 18 on 31st August 2018 taking a full-time further education course in 2018/19. We will be operating three levels of bursary funding: High, Medium and Low priority groups.

High priority group

Some students will be entitled to a grant or bursary of £1200 per annum. You could get this if you are in one of the following categories:

- in care, or recently left care
- in receipt of Income Support, or Universal Credit because you are financially supporting yourself or financially supporting yourself and someone who is dependent on you and living with you such as a child or partner
- in receipt of Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in your own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in your own right

Payments will be made on a termly basis (i.e. 3 times a year) - £600 in term 1, £300 in terms 2 and £300 in term 3. Payments will be subject to review by the Bursary Fund Committee.

If you think you are eligible for this £1200 bursary, complete the main application form and Appendix 1.

Medium priority group

You could receive this level of funding if:

- You have a gross annual household income of below £20,000; **OR**
- You are in receipt of Free School Meals; **OR**
- Your household is in receipt of other income based means tested benefits.

If you think you are eligible for up to £800 per annum support, please complete the main application form and Appendix 2 as you may be eligible for a contribution towards the following specific educational purposes (receipts may be required):

- The cost of transport, essential course equipment, meals in school, course-related trips, UCAS fee, travel to open days, course related sporting activities or other school resources.
- Financial support towards childcare costs and exam re-sit fees if aged 19 or under on 31/08/18.

Payments will be made on a termly basis (i.e. 3 times per year). Maximum of £400 in term 1, maximum of £200 in term 2 and maximum of £200 in term 3. Payments will be subject to review by the Bursary Fund Committee.

Low priority group

You could receive this level of funding if:

- You have a gross annual household income of between £20,000 and £25,000; **OR**
- You have an identifiable financial need and do not fall into high and medium priority groups

If you think you are eligible for up to £200 per annum support, please complete the main application form and Appendix 3 as you may be eligible for a contribution towards the following specific educational purposes (receipts will be required):

- The cost of transport, essential course equipment, meals in school, course related trips, UCAS fee, travel to open days, course related sporting activities or other school resources.

Those in the Low priority group will be considered for funding based on the school's allocation and subject to available funding after those in the High and Medium priority groups have been awarded. Payments may not be made until after 31 December 2018.

Payments will be made on an 'as needed' basis after consideration by the Bursary Fund Committee.
