Pupil Premium

Pupil premium is a formula funded grant which schools receive to help support their disadvantaged pupils.

In 2013-14

How well did our FSM pupils achieve:

Reading:

Level 4: 100% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 4 compared with 90% of non pupil premium pupils.

Level 5: 38% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 5 compared with 52% of non pupil premium pupils.

Progress in reading:

2 levels: 100% of our pupil premium children made the expected 2 levels of progress compared with 96% of non pupil premium pupils.

3 Levels: 63% of our pupil premium children made above expected gaining 3 levels of progress compared with 41% of non pupil premium pupils.

Writing:

Level 4: 88% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 4 compared with 86% of non pupil premium pupils.

Level 5 13% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 5 compared with 41% of non pupil premium pupils.

Progress in Writing:

2 levels: 100% of our pupil premium children made the expected 2 levels of progress compared with 96% of non pupil premium pupils.

3 Levels: 38% of our pupil premium children made above expected gaining 3 levels of progress compared with 50% of non pupil premium pupils.

Mathematics

Level 4: 75% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 4 compared with 100% of non pupil premium pupils. (2 pupil premium pupils did not achieve a level 4)

Level 5: 25% of our pupil premium pupils gained a level 5 compared with 46% of non pupil premium pupils.

2 levels: 88% of our pupil premium children made the expected 2 levels of progress compared with 100% of non pupil premium pupils. (1 pupil premium pupil did not make 2 level of progress)

3 Levels: 50% of our pupil premium children made above expected gaining 3 levels of progress compared with 45% of non pupil premium pupils.
