

Pupil Premium 2015 – 16

What is pupil premium and how we spent our allocation.

Pupil premium is allocated by the government to schools for disadvantaged pupils. These are pupils who are in receipt of Free School Meals. School also receives a smaller amount of funding for Service children.

During the academic year 2015-2016 school will be allocated £54,580. The following is a breakdown of how this money will be spent:

| Use of funding | Purpose | Cost |

| Additional Educational Psychologist sessions. | To allow assessment and referral to additional external support services such as CYPS, Speech and Language and Hearing Impaired Services. | £1200 |
| Resources | Specific resources for pupils such as My Maths to enhance and extend curriculum learning. | £3000 |
| Extra Support Staff | To specifically increase support for disadvantaged pupils in class providing FSM pupils with interventions for Reading, Writing, spelling and handwriting in English and targeted work to ensure attainment of the essential skills and concepts in maths. | £24, 696 |
| External Specialist teacher | Intensive support Programme delivered by an external specialist teacher targeting pupil premium and SEN children. | £3000 |
| Weekly Music sessions | Pupil premium money is used to subsidise music lessons including penny whistle, ukulele and choir | £1100 |
| School Clubs | Participation in lunchtime / after school clubs such as gardening. | £1000 |

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| Visits including Outdoor Residential | Used to subsidise visits and transport costs to events. | £1000 |
| Curriculum enhancement | Theatre groups and dance workshops to enhance curriculum and life experiences. | £3000 |
| Specialist Provision | Addressing individual pupil needs. | £6000 |
| Transport | Providing transport | £3000 |
| Counselling Sessions | 1:1 counselling sessions | £3000 |
| Best Attendance Reward | This is to encourage and reward the best attending class each year to promote excellent attendance. | £500 |

End of year assessments show that :

75% of Pupil premium pupils were working at the expected standard in Reading

72% of Pupil Premium pupils were working at the expected standard in Writing

70% of Pupil Premium pupils were working at the expected standard in Mathematics

26% of Pupil Premium pupils are also on the SEND register.
