

## Summer 2014 Exam Results

### Key Stage 4

Because of changes to the overall exam system the DFE have made clear it is not useful to compare this year's results with previous years' results. The only meaningful comparison is with National and Leicestershire averages from this year. As can be seen below despite the changes to the system and volatility in many results the Academy's results have 'stood up' very well and we have outperformed many schools nationally and locally.

### Key Figures:

#### 5A\*-C including English and Maths

- 62 % 5A\*-C including English and Maths
- 6th in the County

#### Progress in English and Maths

- In English 75% of students made expected progress compared to 70% nationally and 67% in Leicestershire
- In Maths 71% of students made expected progress compared to 65% nationally and 65% in Leicestershire

- The performance of students in English and Maths is outstanding in comparison to National and Leicestershire averages.
- Science is also above National Averages.
