

## Y7 Catch – Up Funding – 2018/19

The Academy receives additional funding to support students that achieve a score of less than 100 from their end of KS2 assessments (100 is considered Secondary School ready). Below are the number of students that fell below this level in the 2018 intake:-

- **English 72**
- **Mathematics: - 53**
- **Both subjects – 37**

### **9 students on entry had no KS2 data**

The number of incoming Year 7 students identified as 'not secondary school ready' shows a slight improvement in mathematics and English compared to 2017 intake.

### **The academy has received £11,332 per annum.**

The packages that are described below use this funding, but draw on other revenue streams in order to meet the needs of these students. In addition resources are purchased to support the learning needs.

There are similar interventions that support students in Y8 and 9 who were not secondary school ready when they joined the Academy. Similarly, 13 x Y10 and 11 Y11 student's access 3 Foundation Learning lessons instead of a 4<sup>th</sup> curriculum option with sessions delivered by subject specialists from each of the core subjects.
