## Review of 2015-2016 spend

## **Early Years**

The Early Year sdata indicated that children eligible for Pupil premium did as well as those children who were not eligible for pupil premium. It also indicated that our pupil premium children did as well as those Nationally.

### **Key Stage 1**

### **Phonics test**

 The phonics test data showed that the small number of disadvantaged pupils did well in comparison with other pupils in the school and all pupils nationally.

### Year 2 data

- The percentage of children who met national expectations was above average in reading, writing and maths.
- The percentage who exceeded expectations was above average in all areas.

### Year 6

 The percentage of children attaining the expected standard in maths and writing was above the National expectation

Maths-81% Writing -83%

- 75% of children eligible for PP met the expected standard in writing
- 70% of children eligible for PP met the expected standard in maths.
- The children eligible for pupil premium had a scaled score of above 100 in writing and maths which is an expected level.

The data indicates that the strategies used supported children who were eligible for pupil premium well in 2015-2016.
