<p><b>Science</b></p> <p>Throughout the year, the children will be taught how to work scientifically', applying such skills as communication, collaboration, analysis and working critically with evidence.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b></p> <p>E-Safety covered in depth during first term and revisited at the start of each following term.</p>	<p><b>MFL</b></p> <p>In French this year, the children will discover a wide range fo speaking and listening techniques.</p>	<p><b>Creative Curriculum</b></p> <p>Creative Curriculum is the umbrella term for the creative and humanities subjects, taught around a 'hook' during each half term.</p>
<p><b>Sound</b></p> <p>This 'Sound' unit will teach your class about how vibrations cause sounds and how sounds travel, as well as how sounds can change pitch and loudness. The children will learn about how sounds are made and will complete a sound survey of their school.</p> <p><b>States of Matter</b></p> <p>This 'States of Matter' unit will teach your class about the differences between solids, liquids and gases, classifying objects and identifying their properties.</p>	<p><b>Photo Stories</b></p> <p>We will focus on important computer skills needed for safe and effective computer use and introduce some further skills concerning the use of folders, searching for files and printing. We will guide the children in further developing their skills in programming and algorithms through accessible means.</p>	<p><b>Le Monde</b> <b>The World</b></p> <p>The children will learn to identify and pronounce accurately the names of some countries and towns, know the points of the compass in French, sing French songs and rhymes on this topic and accurately use key phrases.</p>	<p><b>Riotous Royalty</b></p> <p>This 'Riotous Royalty' unit will teach the children about William the Conqueror's reign from 1066 onwards, how King John made himself very unpopular as monarch and why King Henry VIII married so many times. This unit also teaches who Queen Anne was, what Queen Victoria achieved during her reign and look at the role of the British monarchy today.</p>
