For Health and Social Care there are two courses offered: BTEC First Award Level 2 <http://bit.ly/l2BTEChsc> and BTEC Level 1 Certificate <http://bit.ly/l1BTEChsc> For Level 2 students follow a modular course, comprising four units. The assessment of one unit is by examination, the remaining 3 units are assessed through coursework. Students in year 10 complete unit 1: Human lifespan Development (exam) and unit 3: Effective Communication in Health and Social Care. Students in year 11 complete unit 2: Health and Social Care Values and unit 6: The Impact of Nutrition on Health and Wellbeing.

For Level 1 students follow a modular course, comprising five units. The assessment of all units is through coursework. Students in year 10 complete unit 12: Health and Social Care Needs and unit 18: Communication with Adults and Children in Health and Social Care. Students in year 11 complete unit 6: Introduction to Creative and Leisure Activities for Children and Adults, unit 1: Investigating Rights and Responsibilities at Work and unit 2: Managing your Health at Work.

Key Stage 5

Level 3 Health and Social Care is a nationally recognised vocationally specific qualification to enter employment in the Health and Social Care sector. During this course students will have opportunities for work placements in a Health and Social Care setting. During Year 12 students study 30 credits worth of units. This will mean that students will have achieved the Level 3 Certificate, which is equivalent to a GCE AS Level. During Year 13 students study further units to raise their credit value to achieve a Subsidiary Diploma which is equivalent to one A Level.
