Trip to Liverpool Museum - Tuesday 11 December 2018

Dear Parent/Carer

Your son/daughter has applied for and been chosen to take part in an amazing project in conjunction with Lenovo, PCS Business systems and National Museums Liverpool.

The project's aim is centered on creating distance learning resources for students in a range of educational settings including children in hospital schools such as Great Ormond Street Hospital, giving students the opportunity to visit places that they are currently unable to visit themselves. In conjunction with Elizabeth Woodville Primary School we will be creating our own website to showcase the content and media we create. This will contain resources, lessons and virtual reality experiences for our school and others to explore. The project and equipment such as VR headsets, 180 degree cameras, tablets and laptops are being provided by Lenovo for the duration of our project.

A big part of the project is a trip to National Museums Liverpool, to experience the workshops, exhibitions and hands on resources working alongside and helping students from the Primary School. We will then be using all of the equipment to capture videos, photos and record audio reporting on the workshop experiences and exhibits. The trip will take place on **Tuesday 11th December**, departing from Elizabeth Woodville Primary School at **8:00am** and we will be returning back there at approximately **6pm**. We ask that students arrive at **7:45am** and wait by the school gates - our staff team will be outside waiting for them.

Although the entry fees to the Museums are being funded by Lenovo, we are asking for a contribution for transport costs of £16 per student. This can be paid via Parent Pay please. As part of this process you will be asked to give consent for your child to go on the trip and also supply emergency contact information and any medical information in respect of the student.

The project will be receiving media coverage and a film crew will be following us around on the day, taking photos and filming interviews with staff and pupils. We will also be joined by former Blue Peter presenter, Helen Skelton, who is a spokesperson for the project. She will also be working with the children on the day. We will be spending the day in small groups, with each group being led by a member of our school staff.

Students in Years 7-11 must wear full school uniform and Post 16 should observe their normal dress code and be certain that they are wearing their lanyards. This is essential for safeguarding reasons as they will be working with the younger children. Everyone will need a packed lunch with additional snacks due to the length of the day.

It is shaping up to be a very exciting and memorable project. If you have further questions or queries please contact me at school.
